Marjorie was fortunate to work at Hewlett Packard's San Diego R&D facility and Eastman Kodak's R&D facility as the first digital cameras and inkjet photo printers, and large format fine art printers were being developed. Somewhere around 1994 she started using digital cameras and eventually transitioned away from film use.

Marjorie has always had an artistic and intuitive way of interpreting the world, and her photography work is seen through these same intuitive eyes. She tends to be less interested in the technical

aspects of the equipment and more interested in creating the pieces she sees in her mind. Marjorie definitely likes to be "hands on" and is a strong believer in owning the creative process from capture, to printing, on through to framing.
