Plein Air Painter Char Cee: October Demo

The October demonstration will be by Char Cee Colosia: Still Life / Loose Runny Water Color", on bringing in the autumn colors and discovering "what is this color?" "After extensive study with many prominent artists in my native Southern California, Mexico and abroad," says Char Cee, "I have blended combinations of styles into my own unique form of expression. I have explored various art mediums over the past 40 years, and feel that each has its own special qualities to be used for various effects."

Char Cee is an "on location" painter. "I imagine the world around me into abstract *plein-air* paintings. My

passionate ability to convey feelings and emotions into abstract landscapes, flowers, and people have made me one of the more interesting and innovative artists in San Diego. My philosophy is that any art form should set off the viewer's feelings that have been hidden away. "

With the wind in her hair and the sun on her face, Char Cee lets the artwork takes its own course – driven by the environment. Stop by the October demo and see where she lets her artwork go—

October's Featured Artist, Elaine Seeley

'My academic training in sculpture required hours spent drawing the figure, studying anatomy, and modeling figures in clay," says Elaine Seeley. "I emphasize the human figure in my welded sculptures. My aim is to capture the movement, essence, and energy of the human figure. Most importantly, I work with ideas and observations. Currently, I am working with four themes that interest me: women and the family, the circus, on the beach, and mythology."

Her years of teaching



and exhibiting sculpture have—"hopefully!" she says—helped develop a greater awareness of three-dimensional art's place in the art world. "My objective is to continue to express my love for sculpture." In addition to solo exhibitions on both

coasts, she has participated in group exhibitions in San Diego, La Jolla, Encinitas, Solana Beach, and Carlsbad. She is a long-time member of the San Diego Art Institute. She is also a member of the Carlsbad Oceanside Art League and the San Dieguito Art Guild.

It's not that often that COAL has a Featured Artist who is a sculptor. Stop by the gallery during October and see a floor full of three-dimensional art in these widely diverse themes.
