For many years Hyatt Moore was an occasional painter while working as a Graphic Designer, Art Director and Media Director for various companies and international institutes. He began painting in earnest in 1996, first focusing on international peoples. Then painting became a full time occupation in 2004. An ever-broadening array of subjects and approaches are gained from his many travels throughout the world.

Hyatt lives in Dana Point with his wife, Anne, who is an accomplished print maker. He has also lived in Guatemala, Papua New Guinea, British Columbia, Canada,

Texas, Georgia & Wisconsin. Hyatt has traveled to many countries around the world including Australia, Bolivia, China, England, Germany, Holland, Kenya and many more.

January's Featured Artist: Bradley Kaskin

Bradley Kaskin has been working with water color, oil and pen & ink for over half a century. He graduated from The National Art (school) Academy in Washington, D.C. After trying his hand at



display design for some of Washington's leading department stores and fashion boutiques, he settled into teaching art, specializing in water color. Going against all conventional water color tradition, he found that his style became heavy and rich in color, much like oil painting. After years of painting landscapes and still life, he again challenged the tradition of light and loose water color painting by creating his own unusual technique of heavy, rich and colorful selections of interesting faces, anatomy and other offerings.

"Unusual as it may seem,

I paint in two distinctly different styles. If I feel the painting is of a serious nature, I'll use a traditional style," says Kaskin. "But if a subject matter is light and fun, it will inspire an impressionistic image. I feel that a good painting should always tell a story and set a mood. I often refer to myself as a storyteller with a brush.

Kaskin's paintings are available for individuals to own and enjoy. He can be reached at his studio in Escondido—or stop by the January show and see a selection of his works and style on display as Featured Artist.

MEET THE COAL BOARD FOR 2001



Incoming President: **Charles Dozer**.. Charles Dozer has been a member of the COAL Gallery for several years, and if you entered the Member Show or the Annual Juried Open Show for the last two years, you would have seen him working take-in—usually from the parking lot trying to get you and your art in one piece from the car to the gallery! Charles has also worked on the last two Art Fairs that COAL holds over Labor Day weekend, and this past year was also part of the committee that created the gallery’s bookmark competition. Charles has received ribbons for his digital photography and digital art in many of our shows and took first place in digital art at our last Open Show. He and his wife Marianne enjoy traveling to Mexico, Hawaii, and Europe. Marianne beat Charles to becoming the “president” – she currently serves as the president of Wednesday, Etc., a woman’s social group in Rancho Bernardo. Charles is enthusiastic about leading the gallery into its 60th year as an artistic force in Carlsbad and Oceanside, and feels that the gallery is a real “gem” that can grow to even greater prominence in the year ahead.

VP & Director of Youth Programs: Diane Adams, is active in all 2D media and has been on the board “forever” and a member of COAL since 1972. She coordinates the High School Exhibit in the spring and the scholarships awarded by COAL to high school student artists.

Secretary: Elaine Seeley is a sculptor who has been on the board for seven years (Secretary, Gallery Director, Awards Show Director, Telephone and Outreach Committee Chair) and a member of COAL for nine years. As Board Secretary, Elaine takes and distributes minutes of the Board meetings and maintains the Board Roster, and is the signatory for legal documents.

Corres. Sec: Louise (Lou) Kasza works in water media, oil/acrylic, printmaking, mixed media, digital art, photography and sculpture. She has served on the board since 1999 (including serving as President). This position requires writing and sending letters as requested by the President, substituting for the Secretary when absent, and sending cards to the members as required.

Treasurer & Strategic Planning Chair: David Seeley is a photographer who has been a member of COAL for seven years and has served on the Board that entire time as Treasurer. As Treasurer, David is responsible for maintaining accounting records, paying bills, creating and maintaining the annual budget, filing all government tax returns and related reports, submitting financial reports to the Board and membership, maintaining the gallery lease, permits and licenses, liability insurance and credit card processing service.

Director of Gallery Operations: Felix Bonomo works in photography and digital art, and has been a member of COAL since 2007. Felix has been Gallery Director for 18 months, and is responsible for all gallery operations including take-in, sitting assignments, maintenance, and the annual art festival.

Director of Membership and Publicity: Judy Richardson works in both oil and water media, and has been on the board for a year. She has been a member of COAL for 16 months. As Director of both Membership and Publicity, Judy is responsible for membership applications, forms, records, and updates of membership. In her role as Publicity Chair, Judy provides the publicity for League activities and obtains placement in newspapers, magazines, and other local sources.

Director of Computer Services: Lee Korich works in both watercolor and oil and has been a board member for 3.5 years of the four years she has been a COAL member. As Computer Services Director, Lee is responsible for all of the League’s computer hardware and software, including instructional documentation and user training, when necessary. She also maintains the COAL website, and recently implemented and began maintaining the COAL partnership with Amazon.com.

Co-Director of Awards Shows: Alan Katof is a photographer and also works in digital art. This is his second year as Co-Chair of the Awards show, and Alan has been a member of COAL for three years. As Co-Director of the Awards Show, Alan and his co-chair organize and implement all aspects of the Annual Open Show and Annual Member Show.

Co-Director of Awards Shows: Mary Anne Bloom has been on the Board for ten years and served the last two years as President. Her media are primarily pastel and acrylics, and her favorite colors are blue and purple.

Director of Programs: Karen Crowell works in oil/acrylic and water medias. She has been a member of COAL since 2004 and was Assistant Director of Programs before taking the Directorship. Karen is also a senior member of the Hanging Crew.

Art Mart Co-Chair: Ann Lee Hurd is a photographer who has been on the board for three years and a member of COAL for eight years. As Co-Chair for *Art on the Green*, Ann and Co-Chair **Clara Evans** schedule artists to show on weekends on the Green in Carlsbad, collect money from participating artists, submitting the funds to COAL and representing the Art on the Green artists at Board meetings.

Brushmark Editor : Carol Bonomo is a digital and sketchbook artist who is in her second full year on the board as well as member of COAL. As Brushmark Editor, Carol gathers or writes all copy that appears in the monthly newsletter and prepares the newsletter for both print and mailed distribution to the membership. Carol is also responsible for the “eblasts” to the membership.
