February Demonstrator –

Alison Christler will be demonstrating Friday February 13 at the Calavera Hills Community Center. This will be her first demonstration since announcing a major new series entitled, “Palms Spring Eternal”, in which she will paint, sculpt, sew, or otherwise assemble palm trees for the next two to three years. So of course, her demo will be—that’s right – an oil landscape with palms. For years she has enjoyed painting in a wide variety of media, so when coming up with the idea for the series, she decided to narrow down the subject as a way to hold the series together.

Many wonderful teachers and mentors influenced Alison over the years—some in design, others in technique. Her favorite wet-into wet watercolor techniques are from Chen-Khee Chee, while favorite design influences are Robbie Laird and John Salminen. Favorite attitudes about risk-taking and speed come from Tom Fong and Carla O’Connor. Best advice about thinking outside the box comes from BJ. Wilson (who among other things said, “only show a small portion of your work—just your best”), and best oil painting techniques, along with an understanding of the relationship between value and color, come from Sebastian Capella.

Of course, there are many, many more influences from her days as a workshop junkie, but now she enjoys passing the knowledge along to her students. For the COAL demonstration, she will first use a pallet knife to apply paint rather thickly, then several brushes to refine the surface texture and edges.

FEATURED ARTIST FOR FEBRUARY – *Felix J. Bonomo*

Felix has traveled extensively in China—usually alone so that the places visited and photographed reflect his own interests and interactions. His deep interest in the Chinese culture in particular, and other Asian cultures in general, reflect back to the viewer of his work. Felix is a self-taught photographer, starting with 35 mm and 2-1/4” formats. However, photography took a back seat when family and career took center stage. In 1994, a gift from his son of one of the earliest digital cameras reenergized his desire to work in photography.

After a career in engineering that finished as vice president of international operations, Felix began providing consulting services to U.S. companies doing business in China. He recently retired from engineering consulting, and is now preparing for his first major exhibit—at California State University, San Marcos. The solo exhibit will look at the role of women in China. Felix has been a member of COAL since 2006. He is also a member of the North County Photographic Society and the San Diego Museum of Art Artist’s Guild.

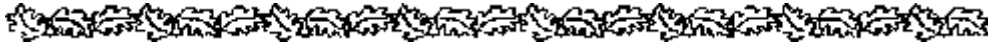
“My camera is my companion when I travel alone,” says Felix. “I try to capture the experience of the ordinary moments in these different cultures. I am drawn to them because of the story they tell. I love photography for what it gives—an opportunity to record a fleeting moment in time, as well as an opportunity to practice a discipline that demands artistic vision and expression as well as trying to master a discipline that still has challenge, even in this age of digital processing. I want to thank COAL for the opportunities provided me during the last two years. Artists are fortunate to have COAL in our lives.”
